Montréal, October 4, 2017 – This fall, Visique is taking part in the World Sight Day Challenge to help raise funds for people in underserved communities who are needlessly blind or vision impaired, simply because they can't access an eye exam and glasses.

Visique will campaign for the challenge throughout October, with World Sight Day being celebrated on Thursday, October 12. All Visique and FYidoctors' clinics across Canada will be participating, with a goal of raising over \$100,000. Fundraising initiatives include in-clinic activities, and a social media campaign where FYidoctors and Visique will donate \$1 for each new page like, up to a maximum of \$10,000.

"It is sad and unfortunate that millions of people struggle to have even something as simple as a pair of reading glasses.
